**Resolution in site** Creating an architectural design for a public urban space is an act of problem solving on multiple levels: How to meet the changing needs of the public? How to reconcile the past and future lives of a city? And not least importantly, how to make an innovative artistic statement that will endure for years to come? Enter "OPEN: New Designs for Public Space," currently at **Van Alen Institute**, a nonprofit architectural think tank. Some of the designs on display—like the digital media center for a Korean subway station by the Seoul/NYC firm Cho Slade (pictured)—have already been realized; some haven't.
